The Michigan Dental Association Foundation is bringing a large scale free dental event to Flint at the Dort Federal Credit Union Event Center May 28-31, 2020

This is a large-scale event that can treat up to 2000 patients in two clinic days. They perform full dental treatment including exam, x-rays, dental cleanings, filling, oral surgery, some root canals, and have a separate department for pediatric patients.

They also will have an on-site Pharmacy and medical team.

This will be their fifth event in Michigan, with the previous ones being held at SVSU, Ferris State College, Calvin College and Macomb Event Center. This Dental event takes around 1400 volunteers.

The mobile dental clinic will arrive from Kansas via a semi-truck and will literally turn the event center into a 110-chair functioning dental clinic with portable dental stations set up in a large public arena. The Mission of Mercy combines the donated services of thousand of dentists, dental hygienists, assistants, laboratory technicians and community volunteers to provide free dental education and care.

Patients served by MOM volunteers are those facing insurmountable barriers to care.

Patients will be treated on a first-come, first-served basis. Hundreds of patients typically line up outside the night before. Care will be provided to adults and children. They will have a triage area to address their most critical needs, including relief of pain and infection.

Flint Association Continues Donations to the Water & Woods Field Service Council

This program has a 110-year history of service to youth and the communities. They help ensure your people in the communities it serves are receiving the necessary training and instruction to become tomorrow's ethical leaders.

- ✓ In 2019, their Scouts recorded over 59,000 of community service, including 224 Eagle Scout service Projects, the capstone achievement of a youth's attainment of the highest rank in the program.
- ✓ Last summer, 1,316 Boy Scouts and 209 Cub Scouts attended a resident camp at one of the camps across the lower peninsula.
- ✓ They served more than 3,000 at-risk youth through the ScoutReach program, where paid program specialists and volunteers delivered Scouting to youth in the Inner City who otherwise would not have access to the character development program.
- ✓ Their Scouts learned and earned! Over 8,200 merit badges were awarded to the Scouts BSA youth, ranging in topics including First Aid, Engineering, Wilderness Survival, Citizenship in the Community, and Space Exploration.
- ✓ On February 1, 2019 they welcomed girls into the Scouts BSA program. Since then the Field service Council has started 26 all-female Scouts BSA troops, service over 1,500 girls in their units.

Due to the support, they are able to continue to make a difference in the lives of our youth and ensure a strong future for Scouting.
